Minutes

Sehlke spoke to the Chamber about standing committees. These committees will be City Connection, By-Laws and Regulations, Industry and Economics, Publicity, Website, Membership and Grant Writing. Sehlke stated the goals of these committees must be Keytesville centered, must be for the advancement of the current businesses, and the creation of new business and to promote the city of Keytesville.

Amanda Webb then spoke about the steps and regulations and options of creating a Chamber website. Sehlke requested that she work a pro/con/cost effectiveness presentation for the February meeting,
