Besides having a dance once per month, Sherry's Place has lunch specials on Tues., Wed., and Thurs, and on the other days one orders off the menu. The lunch specials usually consist of Tuesdays: spaghetti, salad and garlic bread, Wednesdays: hot beef sandwiches and mashed potatoes and gravy, and Thursdays: pork fritters, mashed potatoes and gravy, with another vegetable. The menu offerings include appetizers and assorted sandwiches.

On occasion Sherry has had a dance-a-thon to benefit St. Jude's Childrens Hospital. She also is quite conscientious about saving used aluminum cans and faithfully recycles them, often taking a semi-truck load at a time and using the proceeds from this to benefit her employees at Christmas using the money gained to provide them with Christmas bonuses.
