"When I started all this, I had the idea that maybe that would help school athletics and their programs. I could help teach fundamentals and improve skills. He has coached/had contact hours with these young athletes up to 8th grade. He helped follow-up on an idea of an "Itty-Bitty basketball" program for Pre School to 4th Grade. This is the 4th year for this adventure. It takes place over 5 Saturday beginning in January. 'it doesn't matter how well you play in all sports, it is just fun." I wish all the parents of the players were able to stay and watch their players. They are so happy to just be on the court playing. Sometimes they win but through athletics they learn that is all right to lose.
